

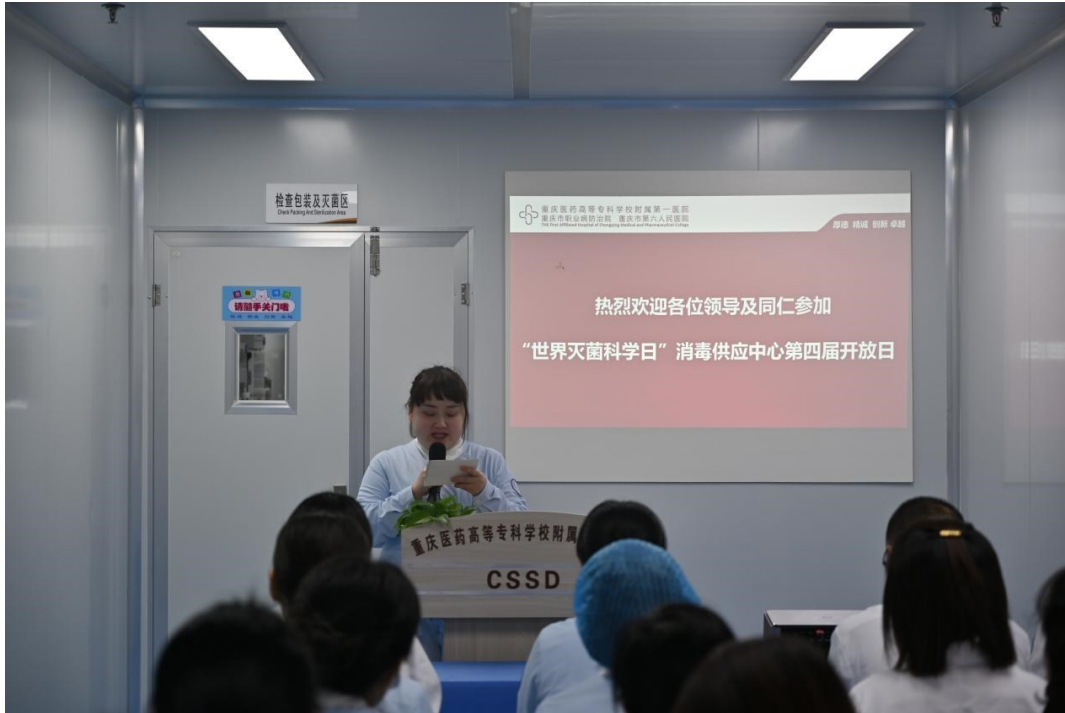
Unlocking the Secrets of Packaging: Building a Healthy Defense Line

The 4th International Day of Sterilisation Sciences · CSSD Open Day

On April 10, the CSSD of the First Affiliated Hospital of Chongqing Medical and Pharmaceutical College successfully held its 4th Open Day themed “Unlocking the Secrets of Packaging: Building a Healthy Defense Line.” The event invited functional departments, department heads, head nurses, and key staff to participate.



The activity was hosted by Luo Yi, who introduced the purpose of this event. This event focused on the critical “packaging process,” aiming to enhance clinical departments’ understanding of the packaging process in sterile supply and to strengthen awareness of hospital infection prevention and control.



Director Ma Xiaoling of the Hospital Infection Control Department delivered a speech, comparing packaging to the “armor” worn by medical instruments, emphasizing the importance of packaging. She mentioned that the sterile barrier created by packaging materials not only protects medical instruments but also represents a commitment to life. She hoped that clinical departments would understand the significance of packaging in infection prevention and control through this event.



Following this, Zuo Li reported on the careful selection of packaging materials, the strict control of the packaging process, and the continuous improvement of packaging quality. High-quality

packaging is not only a protection for medical instruments but also a commitment to medical quality and respect for patients' lives. Through the introduction of the characteristics of packaging materials and packaging methods and requirements, participants gained a deeper understanding of packaging.



During the tour, the staff of the CSSD guided everyone through the inspection, packaging and sterilization areas, providing detailed explanations of the entire process of assembling, packaging, sealing, and labeling. During the visit, staff showed different types of packaging materials, explained their characteristics and range of application, and demonstrated standardized packaging operations. Participants experienced the entire packaging process on-site and understood the importance of packaging in ensuring sterilization effectiveness and the sterile status of instruments.



At the end of the event, participants engaged in face-to-face discussions about their work concerns, further enhancing mutual understanding and providing valuable feedback on the operations of the CSSD.



In the future, the CSSD will continue to strengthen its development, keep exploring and being innovative, and build a solid defense line for patient health, promoting the quality of medical services to a higher level.
